The Volunteer and Community Resource Management program through the Educational Consortium for Volunteerism prepares students to work with volunteers in the community, non-profit agencies, and businesses. Students will learn key aspects of volunteer management, leadership, community asset mapping, program planning and evaluation. These skills are critical to most professions and can be easily transferred to other types of work.

This Academic Certificate requires 12 hours in coursework. All coursework for the certificate is 100% Internet-delivered. These courses can be used as a professional development concentration in the Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences degree, as electives, or toward the minor in Leadership of Community and Nonprofit Organizations.
