#### College-wide\* Competitive Scholarship Descriptions

Below are the specific scholarships for which you may be considered.

#### **Advisory Board Scholarship (Undergraduate)**

Created by the College of Public Affairs & Community Service Advisory Board, this scholarship is open to undergraduate students enrolled full time in PACS with either a 3.0 Overall GPA or 3.0 UNT Cumulative GPA or above.

#### Joyce Ann Brown & Popo Gonzalez Scholarship (Undergraduate)

Open to undergraduate students enrolled full time in the College of Public Affairs & Community Service with either a 2.5 Overall GPA or 2.5 UNT Cumulative GPA or above.

#### Gail Rola Memorial Service Learning Scholarship (Undergraduate)

Open to undergraduate students enrolled full time in the College of Public Affairs & Community Service with either a 2.5 Overall GPA or 2.5 UNT Cumulative GPA or above

#### The William A. Luker Scholarship (Graduate)

In honor of Dr. William A. Luker, Dean of PACS from 1982-1991, this scholarship is open to graduate student's enrolled full time in the College of Public Affairs & Community Service with a 3.0 GPA or above. No awardee may work more than 20 hours per week, including work as a teaching fellow, a research assistant, or in the college Work Study Program.

## College of Public Affairs and Community Service University of North Texas Competitive Scholarship Criteria

Scholarships awarded by the College of Public Affairs & Community Service Scholarship Committee require recipients to fulfill certain criteria while they hold the scholarship. The criteria for all PACS scholarships require that recipients:

- 1. Possess the minimum entrance and continuing academic performance standards of the College of Public Affairs & Community Service in effect at the time of the award. Undergraduate recipients must enroll for and successfully complete at least twelve (12) semester hours of course work at the University of North Texas during each semester they hold the scholarship. Graduate recipients must enroll for and successfully complete at least nine (9) semester hours of course work at the University of North Texas during each semester they hold the scholarship. The only exceptions to this rule apply to recipients who have fewer than 24 or 18 hours remaining in their degree program or those who request a reduced load as a disability accommodation. These students may divide their remaining hours as evenly as possible between the fall and spring semesters. Recipients who fail to fulfill this semester-hour requirement will forfeit all or a portion of their scholarship.
- 2. Be available to attend college events
- **3.** Submit a handwritten thank-you note to the donor representative(s) of your scholarship within two weeks of accepting the scholarship otherwise the scholarship offer will be withdrawn
- 4. Be a continuing student within the College of Public Affairs & Community Service.
- 5. Answer the following two essay questions:
  - A). Describe any community service, volunteer participation, or other experiences that are service-related, including courses that have service learning projects. Why did you choose these settings? What role did you play?
